# <u>Dinosaur Roar by Paul and Henrietta Stickland</u> <u>Book of the Week Activities</u>

Here are some activities to try at home related to the book of the week - Dinosaur (please see video of story).



#### DALIL & MEMBLETTA STICKLAND

#### <u>Monday</u>

Talk to a member of your family about the book. Which is your favourite dinosaur and why? Were

some of them scary? What made them scary? Talk about what you know about dinosaurs, and maybe do some investigating to find out more. Could dinosaurs fly? Did they lay eggs? What did they eat?

#### **Tuesday**

Watch the story of Dinosaur Roar again (or read it if you have it at home). Join in with some of the words using the pictures to help. Can you use different voices for each of the different dinosaurs? How could you use your face and body to pretend to be that dinosaur?

### **Wednesday**

Create a picture of a dinosaur in whatever way you want - painting/drawing/collage, etc. Can you add any labels to show the different parts of the dinosaur (e.g. sharp teeth)? Find out what your dinosaur ate and draw this in the picture too).

## **Thursday**

All of the dinosaurs in Dinosaur Roar look different to each other. Pick a dinosaur from the book or a type of dinosaur you know already and make a costume/mask so you can 'become' that dinosaur. Look at the colour of their bodies, the length of their tails, have they got sharp teeth, do they have spikes/lumps/patterns on their back? Try to add lots of detail to make your costume super special!

#### Friday

Tell an adult or older brother or sister a story about a dinosaur and ask them to write it down for you. Try to use as much detail as you can. Think about what will happen at the start, middle and end of you story, and don't forget to draw a picture.
