Term: Autumn One 2022

English:

In English this term, Year 2 will be focusing on writing narratives. We will start exploring traditional tales through 'Goldielocks and The Three Bears'. We will be continuing to progress through Little Wandle Phonics ensuring we cover all sounds and tricky words. As part of this, children will be in reading groups for supported reading.

Mathematics:

In maths this term, our focus will be on Place Value. We will be learning to read and write numbers to 100 in numerals and words. We will also be learning to recognise the place value of each digit in a two digit number. The children will compare and order numbers using the <, > and = signs.

Science:

This term we will be learning about living things and their habitats.

We will be learning to group things according to whether they are living or non-living. We will be matching animals to their habitats. We will look at how some animals are adapted to their habitats.

Theme/Curriculum Focus: The Great Fire of London

History:

In history we will be learning about the Great Fire of London. The children will be able to recount the details of the event and put the events into chronological order. We will also be investigating why people in the past acted as they did and how the events of the past have effected the future.

Arts and DT:

Mrs McCaffery will be introducing sketchbooks to Year 2 so that they are able to explore and draw. In DT, we will be making moving monsters and cooking.

Music:

We will be learning some West African call and response songs in music. We will be exploring different instruments and learning key vocabulary such as rhythm, tempo and call and response.

PE/Games:

The children will be developing their ball skills in football this term.

RE: We will be learning about Hinduism this term. Our key questions will explore why people worship. We will also learn about the celebration of Diwali and why it is important to Hindus.
