Dear Mums, Dads and Carers,

Another really good week in school. I was pleased to share some fabulous writing and home reading diaries in assembly this morning. Huge praise must go to Year Five; everyone in school, each class, everyday this week; wow!!!

Next week is Children's Mental Health week. There are a number of events taking place. We have a survey for children to complete to indicate their perspective on how school contributes to their mental wellbeing. To raise awareness of the importance of children and young people's mental health, on Monday 5th February, we would like to invite all children, staff and parents to 'Dress to Express'. This could be through favourite colours, hairstyles, favourite sports kits, fancy dress, party clothes...whatever your child wants to wear as an expression of themselves. Be as creative as you like!

There will be assemblies on this day delivered by the Mental Health Support Team

On another note, I need to clarify our approach to children being collected by older siblings. In our policy it states very clearly that we do consider siblings over 16yrs collecting children. Occasionally, following parental requests we allow siblings in Yrs 8 and 9 to collect brothers and sisters in Yrs3 or 4. Children in Yrs 5 and 6 can go home by themselves with written permission. The policy below applies with no exception to the children in EYFS and KS1.

The suitability of an older sibling (aged 16 years or above) caring for a younger child needs to be considered on a case-by-case basis, by a judgment of the potential risks of this arrangement; the maturity of the child collecting/being collected; the length and nature of the journey home, the behaviour and relationship of the children collecting/being collected.
